



ACCREDITATION UPDATE: CCC EARNS SEVEN YEAR REAFFIRMATION

On June 6, 2018, the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges, Western Association of Schools and Colleges (ACCJC) met and reaffirmed CCC's accreditation status for seven years. A follow-up report is due on October 1, 2019. In their June 13, 2018 letter, the ACCJC offered two commendations:

1. CCC's readiness project with Clovis Unified School District, which resulted in 95% of a diverse cohort ready to take a college-level English course or complete the freshman English requirement
2. CCC's multifaceted tutorial center and for initiating live video tutoring sessions to enhance student success.

PRESIDENT BENNETT ELECTED TO CEOCCC BOARD
