THE NEW "WELCOME CENTER" UNVEILED

Their latest project is the opening of a "Welcome Center" located next to the lobby in AC1. This repurposed conference room is centrally located, highly visible and permanently open Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. It is staffed by student ambassadors and student success coaches Sasha Fisher and Nate Saari and offers various services including adding or dropping classes, college resources, and application assistance.



THE "CRUSH" FOOD PANTRY NOW OPEN

Faculty, staff and students worked hard over the summer to ensure the food pantry would be ready for the fall semester. The food pantry is available to all CCC students at the main campus and the Herndon campus. This project was made possible with the support and help of the Central California Food Bank.
