VALLEY COMMUNITY SBDC AT CCC CONTINUES TO HELP BUSINESSES DURING COVID-19

SBDC Director Rich Mostert and his team have been busy providing free coaching on gaining access to the funding available through the federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act. Rich was recently notified that the Valley Community SBDC earned \$350,000 of additional funding to provide COVID-19 related small business services. Businesses have access to webinars on government contracting, the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP), loan forgiveness, and reopening regulations.

CHSU & CCC PROMOTE PHARMACY PATHWAY PROGRAM



The California Health Sciences University (CHSU) and CCC partnership helps students accelerate their path to completing the CHSU prerequisites, applying to CHSU, and completing their PharmD degree: a student can become a pharmacist, serving as a vital health care provider for our community, in approximately five to six years. This month CCC and CHSU launched a campaign to inform all students in STEM and health majors about the pharmacy pathway program. The campaign includes mailed postcards and a social media component, reaching all students with a potential interest in this pathway.

TECHNOLOGY LOAN PROGRAM HELPS STUDENTS

Summer school students have access to the college's technology loan program and can checkout laptops, calculators, and headphones. Students complete an online form and are given an appointment time to come to campus to pick up the items at a safe and efficient drive-thru curbside event.

UPDATE ON EMERGENCY RESPONSE FALL 2020 PLANNING SUB-GROUP

A sub-group continues to work on plans for a safe reopening this fall. Most classes will be held online with an exception of a few limited courses that require face-to-face interaction. The group meets regularly to discuss various health and safety measures including facial coverings, procedures to disinfect classrooms, installation of sanitizing stations, social distancing guidelines, plexiglass installation, and signage.
