ABOUT THE COLLEGE

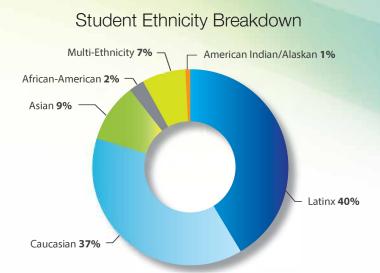

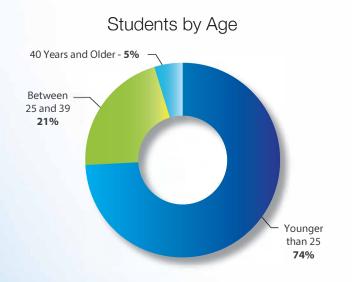

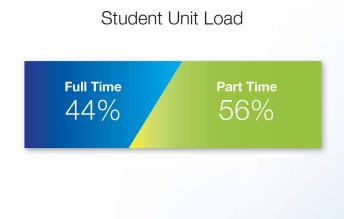

ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Accredited in 2015, the College's culture is based on a commitment to and a vision for creating and maintaining a collaborative teaching and learning environment that fosters equitable student achievement and academic excellence.

Dedicated to the educational attainment and economic well being of the communities it serves, Clovis Community College partners with local educational institutions, such as the K-12 School Districts and Fresno State, to create smooth pathways from secondary through postsecondary education. POSITION DESCRIPTION

This Vice President of Student Services (VPSS) position is a new position for the College, added to support its growth in student enrollment. The successful candidate for this position will be a creative, dynamic, and collaborative leader who is committed to advancing student access, equity, and success for our diverse student body. The VPSS collaborates with the Vice President of Instruction, Vice President of Administrative Services, and a dedicated team of professionals to ensure that the College maintains its strong integration of student services and instruction while working toward achieving the College's mission and strategic goals. The VPSS reports directly to the College President and provides senior-level vision and leadership for the Student Services Division. The VPSS is responsible for the development of new programs and the management, planning, budgeting, administration, and evaluation of current programs, services, personnel, policies, and procedures in the Student Services Division. The VPSS is responsible for ensuring compliance with federal, state, local, and district regulations. The VPSS is responsible for creating and maintaining an environment of collegiality and inclusiveness for the College's diverse student body. The specific programs reporting to the VPSS are subject to change based on the needs of Clovis Community College students.





DESIRED CHARACTERISTICS

The Screening Committee and the College President will consider the following desirable characteristics in their selection of the first VPSS for Clovis Community College.



Committed to Student Access, Success, and Equity

- A leader whose philosophical commitment to student access, success, and equity has been demonstrated through changes in institutional strategies and policies that resulted in improved student achievement.
- A leader who has demonstrated the ability to work effectively as an executive team member committed to collaborative integration of instruction, student services, and business services to enhance the learning and working environment for students, faculty, and staff.

Takes Strategic Risks

- A leader who is willing to take significant data-informed risks and inspires changes in how everyone across the College thinks and acts to improve student outcomes.
- A leader who is committed to identifying gaps in student outcomes on the basis of factors such as race, ethnicity, and gender, and then mobilizing the College to improve results.
- A leader who has demonstrated experience and knowledge of data driven decision-making related to enrollment management and student retention.



Builds Strong Teams

- A decisive and pragmatic leader who has been successful in developing collaborative relationships with a diverse college constituency that fosters cohesion and a sense of pride in working together for the good of the students.
- A leader who is guided by ethics and honesty, is committed to transparency and inclusiveness in decision-making, and promotes the application of ethics across the College and District.
- A leader who promotes cohesiveness and respect among all College and District constituents; resolves
 controversial issues and problems in a timely manner using input from constituent groups, and who is sensitive
 to the effects of decisions on students, the College, and the District.
- A consensus builder committed to faculty and staff diversity who uses and promotes an open, approachable
 management style that is inclusive, collaborative and enthusiastic and who values and supports staff
 development, motivates employees, and acknowledges their contributions.

QUALIFICATIONS

Minimum Qualifications

In keeping with the minimum qualifications for faculty and administration in California Community Colleges, the candidate must demonstrate that he/she satisfies all of the following:

- An earned Master's degree from an accredited college or university
- One year of formal training, internship, or leadership experience reasonably related to the administrator's administrative assignment or possession of a valid California Community College Supervisory Credential
- Demonstrated sensitivity to and understanding of the diverse academic, socioeconomic, cultural, disability, gender identity, sexual orientation, and ethnic backgrounds of community college students

Desired Qualifications

- Earned doctorate from an accredited institution
- Teaching or student services experience, preferably at the postsecondary level
- At least three years of successful, progressively responsible management or administrative experience in student services, or a related field, preferably in a community college or other post-secondary institution

COMPENSATION

Salary: \$120,563 - \$151,863 based on education and experience. A doctoral stipend of \$2,021 is available. In addition, the District offers an attractive fringe benefit package including medical, dental, and vision coverage for the employee and dependents, and life insurance for employees. Employees are also members of the California State Teachers' Retirement System (CalSTRS).
