The tournament was a large event hosting over 40 colleges nationwide, including University of Utah and Northwestern University in Illinois. There were over 900 entries in the various events offered, and in the end, our Speech and Debate



were victorious. Out of our ten competitors, seven of them qualified for the final rounds. Audrey Turner went undefeated in six rounds of International Public Debate Association (IPDA) style debate and took Gold. Audrey also took fourth place speaker out of 107 speakers in the division.
