The Clovis Community College Associate in Arts Degree in Communication Studies for Transfer is designed to prepare students to continue studies toward a B.A. Degree in Communication or for entry level into a variety of career options that require competent and ethical communication skills.

Students can pursue an advanced communication degree and specialize in various areas, such as public relations, mass communication and journalism, or radio and television.

To obtain the Associate in Arts Degree in Communication Studies for Transfer, students must complete the following requirements with a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.0:

- The Communication Studies major requirements that follow the California State University General Education (CSUGE) Breadth or the Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) requirements.
- Any needed transferable electives to reach a total of 60 CSU transferable units.
