

Foreign Language - What course do I take?

<p>I have never studied this language before and am not a native speaker. (See bottom of page for native speaker.)</p> <p>Level 1</p>	<p>Level 1 – First half of beginner sequence</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Spanish 1 offered every semester • French 1 offered every semester • Chinese 1 and German 1 offered when there is demand
<p>I have studied this language for two years in high school or have had some other life experience that has prepared me with minimal communication skills in this language.</p> <p>Level 2</p>	<p>Level 2 – Second half of beginner sequence</p> <p>Two yrs. of high school foreign language study is the pre-requisite for level 2. If the college has your transcript on file you are able to enroll in level 2. If the college does not have proof that you have met the pre-requisite, obtain a Pre-requisite Challenge form from a counselor and contact a full-time foreign language instructor to evaluate your skills and sign the form.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Spanish 2 offered every semester • French 2 offered every other semester
<p>I have studied this language for three years in high school or have had some other life experience that has prepared me with basic communication skills in this language including speaking, reading, and writing at a basic level.</p> <p>Level 3</p>	<p>Level 3 – First half of intermediate sequence</p> <p>Three years of high school foreign language study is the pre-requisite for level 3. If the college does not have proof that you have met the pre-requisite, obtain a Pre-requisite Challenge form from a counselor and contact a full-time foreign language instructor to evaluate your skills and sign the form.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Spanish 3 typically offered in fall semester • French 3 may be available at FCC
<p>I have studied this language for four years in high school, taken an AP class in this language, or have had some other life experience that has prepared me with communication skills in this language including speaking, reading, and writing at the intermediate level.</p> <p>Level 4</p>	<p>Level 4 – Second half of intermediate sequence</p> <p>Four years of high school foreign language study is the pre-requisite for level 4. If the college does not have proof that you have met the pre-requisite, obtain a Pre-requisite Challenge form from a counselor and contact a full-time foreign language instructor to evaluate your skills and sign the form.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Available when demand increases
<p>I am a native speaker of Spanish. Perhaps I can understand spoken Spanish quite well but have difficulty with spelling and written accent marks. I can speak it pretty well, but may use a lot of slang. I think it would be a good idea to improve my Spanish.</p> <p>2, 3, and 4NS</p>	<p>Level 2NS, 3NS or 4 NS (NS = Native Speaker)</p> <p>This sequence of courses is for native speakers.
