To obtain the Associate in Arts in Anthropology for Transfer Degree, students must complete the following requirements:

- 1. Completion of 60 semester units or 90 quarter units chat are eligible for transfer to the California State University, including both of the following:
 - a. The Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) or the California State University General Education Breadth requirements.
 - b. A minimum of 18 semester units or 27 quarter units in a major or area of emphasis, as determined by the community college district.
- 2. Obtainment of a minimum grade point average of 2.0. Associate Degrees for Transfer (ADTs) also require chat students must earn a "C" grade or better in all courses required for the major or area of emphasis.
