Student Ambassadors offered smiles and helped students at various Welcome Week tables throughout campus January 12 through 15.


The new student welcome event "Crush Days" was held on January 9. Students learned about various campus programs and resources to help them be successful in college.

CRUSH ATHLETICS UPDATE

Fall Team GPAs:

- Women's soccer – **2.84**
- Men's soccer – **3.13** (first time ever above 3.0)
- Men's cross country – **3.39**

Volleyball – **3.42**

- Women's cross country – **3.44**
- **3.24 Department GPA** (highest ever)

Also, we had 25 fall student-athletes earn a 4.0, and 67 student-athletes had a 3.0 or better, which represents 73% of our Fall population.

Men's and women's cross country, volleyball, and men's soccer all advanced to postseason play and women's soccer missed it by one spot (they were 25th and we had to be in the top 24). In the Central Valley Conference, men's cross country won their 3rd consecutive championship and the women finished 2nd. Men's soccer finished 3rd (best ever finish), volleyball finished 2nd in our first season, and women's soccer finished 5th. Men's cross country finished 2nd at the 3C2A NorCal Regional

Championships and the women were 5th. Finally, men's cross country finished 7th at the 3C2A State Championship and the women were 9th.

We also had 27 fall student-athletes named All-Central Valley Conference, Vicky Cuellar from women's soccer was CVC Defender of the Year; Davis Bosch from XC was men's XC Runner of the Year; and Coach CJ Albertson was CVC Men's Coach of the Year. Max Jauregui, Davis Bosch, and Dylan Devine from XC were named 3C2A All-Region. Christopher Barranco and Dylan Devine were named 3C2A All-State. Madison Martinez from women's soccer was named a Scholar All-American.
