Clovis Community College selected as a Bellwether Finalist!

> Clovis Community College was selected as a finalist for the prestigious Bellwether Award for its collaboration with Clovis Unified Schools District. The Bellwether Awards annually recognize outstanding and innovative programs and practices that are successfully leading community colleges into the future. Clovis is one of 10 finalists out of 400 nominees nationwide. Clovis Community College sent a team, including representatives from CCC, CUSD, and SCCCD to present as finalists at the 2018 Community College Futures Assembly Conference in Florida on January 29, 2018.

The team presented on the successful "Curriculum Alignment Project" with the Clovis West English Department which prepares high school seniors for college-level English through aligned and dual enrollment courses. Faculty from Clovis Community College and Clovis Unified School District worked together to align curriculum and core standards. As part of the program, college level English classes are offered during the senior year as dual enrollment classes

Clovis Community College successfully increased the number of high school graduates eligible to take transferlevel English Composition & Reading from 33% to 95% at a minority/majority, low socio-economic base high school. In addition, 20% of these students already completed college credit while in high school. More than a dual-enrollment program, this project is transformational, built on rigorous standards for academics and collegereadiness skills, and supported by a community of practice that encourages innovation and excellence. Participation and success by minority students was equal to that of non-minority students.

CCC's NEW Mechatronics / Industrial Automation courses start February 5

Instructor Matthew Graff has partnered with local businesses to develop the new curriculum. He has been busy with various media interviews promoting the new CTE courses that will prepare students for manufacturing jobs in a variety of industries. AC1 Lobby with the Program Logic Controller (PLC) where interested students could learn more about the courses.

The team is very proud of former team member, Tanner Davis, Last year's CVC Swimmer of the Year and CCCAA State Qualifier. Mr. Tanner just received an athletic scholarship to attend and compete at South Dakota State University. As far as we know, he is the school's first ever Division 1, athletic transfer! He will be trading his Crush swim cap for a Jackrabbits swim cap this semester.

Men's Conference Coach of the Year, Mark Bennett, will be relinguishing his duties as Head Coach of the Men's Swim and Dive team. He will still retain the position of Women's Head Coach. Replacing Coach Bennett will be CCC Swim and Dive Assistant Coach Jordan Morillo. Coach Morillo has been on board since the start of the Swim and Dive programs, was a team captain and letter winning swimmer at Fresno State, and also a current Master's of Science candidate at Fresno State. Also adding to the coaching staff is diving coach Sarah Strand. Coach Strand is also a former Bulldog and currently coaches Clovis Dive Club. Coach Strand holds a Master of Science from Fresno State. One more addition to the swim staff is recent Fresno State grad, Hannah Jarvis. Coach Jarvis was a 2 year letter winner with the Bulldogs as well as a Community College CCCAA All-American at Sierra College in the Sacramento Metro Area. Coach Jarvis has built her resume the last few years as an assistant coach with the Clovis Swim Club.
