### UPDATED PROGRAM PLANNING PROCESS

Early in Clovis' time as an independent college, faculty and staff recognized the need for developing our own process for program review. This process of review and analysis is critical in continuous quality improvement and provides important information for program planning and development. Over the course of the 2017-2018 academic year, the college worked diligently to revamp what is now called the Unit/Program Plan (UPP). The process has been streamlined and will now occur on a two-year cycle (as opposed to five). This will allow units and programs to be more flexible and responsive to outcomes assessment results and implement practices that are shown to best support student success.

### "CRUSH DAYS" EVENT WELCOMES NEW STUDENTS

The annual new student welcome known as "Crush Days" will be on August 7 and 8 with hundreds in attendance to learn more about Clovis Community College.
