It's a busy time of year for our Outreach and Counseling Departments who are visiting local feeder high schools to provide seniors with academic advising and registration. President Dr. Kim E. Armstrong joined the RTG event at Clovis East High School on February 15.

"CRUSH" ATHLETICS UPDATE

Rhiannon Walker ran 18:06 in the 5k for a school record and earned the State "A" qualifying time. Julia Martinez ran 18:25 which is also a State "A" time. They are ranked 3rd and 6th in the 5k in the State respectively, and #1 and #2 in Northern California (NorCal). They are also ranked 3rd and 9th respectively in the 1500m from previous meets performances (Also #1 and #2 in NorCal). Guillermo Lopez set school records in the 1500 (4:00.77) and 5k (15:31.62). His 1500m times ranks him 8th in the State. Marcus Jauregui set the school record in the 800 (1:55.02), got the State "A" time and is now ranked 4th in state. Quincy Patton ran 1:55.96 in the 800 which ranks him 8th in the State. He is also ranked top 10 in the 400m which is his primary event. Lisbeth Mendez ran 19:43 for 5k which is ranked 7th in NorCal. Genevieve Tamondong is currently ranked 5th in NorCal and 13th in the State in the 800m.



Also, we rolled out a new online feature this week, "The Student-Athlete Retreat with Coach Dre," that will discuss different topics related to successfully navigating the student-athlete experience here at Clovis (mental and physical health and wellbeing, positive lifestyle choices, effective study habits, etc.). CCC may be the first community college providing this valuable information. If it proves to be impactful, we plan to look at expanding into vlogs and possibly some in-person experiences.
