Small Business Development Center – Successful Grand Opening event!



Although Director Rich Mostert has been hard at work since last December, the grand opening of the Small Business Development Center (SBDC) located at our Herndon Campus was just hosted on July 25. The SBDC offers access to business development resources and consulting to students and the community. Mr. Mostert has done an excellent job of building partnerships with local leaders and entrepreneurs. These relationships provide opportunities to our students and showcase the college's collaborative work ethic. To date, the SBDC has facilitated over \$7.1 million in capital infusion for clients, supported the creation/retention of 721 jobs, and conducted/co-sponsored workshops for over 1,500 attendees.

Budget Update

There have been some changes to the Student Success allocation component of the Student Centered Funding Formula for 2019-20. These changes should even out the allocations for districts as long as their enrollments remain stable.

70% Base Allocation (FTES)

20% Supplemental Allocation (Pell, California Promise Grant-former BOG waiver)

10% Student Success Allocation (Associate Degree Transfers, Degrees, and Certificates)

- Counts only to the highest award (no more stacking) and student must be enrolled in the district in the year the award was granted.
- Transfer student must complete 12 or more units in the year prior to transfer
- Student Success Allocation based on three year average of each of the measures in the allocation

Clovis Community College received one time equipment funding and additional lottery funding for 2019-20. The total amount of funding is just under \$450,000. If you have an equipment or supply need, please contact your dean or manager to put in a request. Requests are due on September 6, 2019.



Community College Survey of Student Engagement (CCSSE)

In the spring of 2019, the Office of Institutional Research administered the CCSSE in 32 randomly selected sections. Students responded to questions about student engagement, college culture, student supports, academic counseling, matriculation, and a variety of other topics. This is the fourth time the college has participated in this survey. In addition to providing valuable information about our students and their experience at the college, the survey is validated and benchmarked, which provides the ability to compare with other cohorts of colleges. We will be discussing and analyzing the results of this survey over the course of the academic year.

Before digging too deeply into the results, we want to celebrate the exceptional experience that our students are receiving. The survey asks two general student satisfaction questions. For both, we find that our students are overwhelming satisfied with their experience at the college. Furthermore, CCC outperforms the comparison cohort for both questions.

Email Migration to Office 365:

Starting in September, all Clovis Community College staff will have their email boxes migrated to Office 365, which will increase the quotas on our email accounts to 100 GB. This migration will happen in about four batches. If your account is scheduled to be migrated, you will receive an email the week before. On the weekend that your email is moved, you may lose connection (but not messages) to your mailbox on Sunday afternoon. The first group is scheduled to be migrated September 6-9.

Your email address account will not change. However, we may need to reconfigure Outlook on your personal mobile devices and assist with loading your email archives. Our district office is providing extra technical support onsite each Monday and Tuesday following each email migration. The extra tech support personnel are student workers from across our district, including several of our own.

SharePoint and the Crush HUB:

Our Crush Hub is up and operational. Please visit and familiarize yourself with how to access agendas, meeting notes, and documents from across our college's governance structure. 
