### Board of Trustees Approved Vaccine Mandate for State Center Community College District

On August 23, 2021, the Board of Trustees voted to mandate vaccines for students, employees, contractors, and visitors effective October 15, 2021. On September 24, 2021, the Board of Trustees also passed resolution 2021.36 which extended the vaccine mandate effective date for students to November 15, 2021. The resolution also allows specific exemptions for athletic competitions and student performance events. The colleges and district services groups are working together to implement the details of this policy.

### All Are Welcome Here Sign

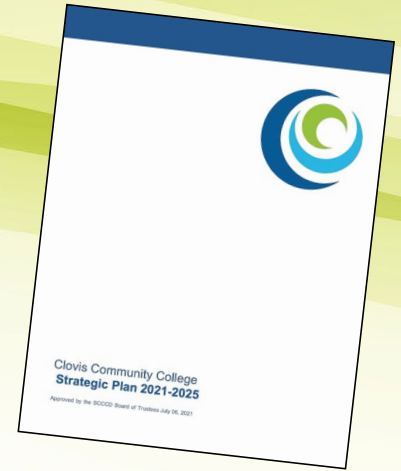

## CCC New Strategic Plan 2021-2025 Approved

At the July Board of Trustees meeting, the Board adopted Clovis Community College Strategic Plan 2021-2025. The CCC Strategic Plan 2021-2025 is the result of college-wide collaboration to create a plan that focuses on achieving the Institutional Goals outlined in our CCC Educational Master Plan and aligns with the District Mission and Overarching Goals outlined in the District Strategic Plan 2020-2024.

The Strategic Plan translates the board goals developed in the Clovis Community College Educational Master Plan 2017-2027 into specific actions that will advance the college and support student success over the next four years. It also supports current statewide community college initiatives including Vision for Success, Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion, Guided Pathways, and the important connection between instruction and student services to increase student completion.

## Clovis Community Welcomes New Students on Campus

Clovis invited new and returning students to campus for two exciting in-person events at the end of July.

Crush Days is Clovis' new student welcome event where incoming students are invited to learn about helpful topics that will prepare them for the fall semester such as textbooks, Canvas, WebAdvisor, technology checkout, parking, financial aid, and more. Staff, students, and faculty greeted over 300 students and parents throughout the four sessions on July 27 and 29. After a warm welcome from President Bennett and VP Chahal, students took part in an information session

designed to cover the details that would ensure a smooth transition to the college. Student Ambassadors then led attendees on a campus tour, pointing out classrooms and service areas. Crush Day concluded with a resource fair where students had an opportunity to learn more about programs at CCC, ask additional questions, receive technology help, and get their Crush Cards. As a final farewell, students were given their first Clovis Crush shirt to officially welcome them to our community! Crush Days continued throughout the week of August 2-6 with virtual workshops and information sessions for students who wish to participate online.



Students were also invited to attend an in-person Extreme Registration where new, current, and returning students could complete all of their matriculation steps in one event. Over 185 students were served on July 30 and 31 by representatives from Outreach, Student Activities, Financial Aid, Counseling, and Admissions and Records. These events were a continuation of the virtual Extreme Registration Wednesdays held throughout June and July. Many students came with their parents and other supporters to enroll in in-person, online, and hybrid classes. Clovis staff were excited to help brand-new students from application to registration in the Open Computer Lab, a new location that allowed all services to be housed in one area – a true one-stop-shop!

## Applied Tech Building Updates

The Applied Technology Phase 1 project was released for bid on September 20, 2021. Bids are due back in mid-November. We anticipate taking the recommendation to award the project to the Board of Trustees in December 2021 or January 2022. After board approval to award, we resubmit the information to the California Community College Chancellor's Office for authorization to award the bid. This can take 30-60 days. If all stays on schedule, we anticipate groundbreaking on the new building to occur in March or April of 2022. Completion of the project is expected in fall of 2023.

## **Inspiring the next generation of scientists through Genomics Data Science research projects and “Science Talks” at Clovis Community College**

Dr. Rosa Alcazar, in collaboration with Dr. Stephanie Coffman, Dr. Malachi Whitford, and partners at Johns Hopkins University, Carnegie Science and Stanford School of Medicine, has developed a Research in Genomics Biol-12 course for our students at Clovis Community College (<https://www.cloviscollege.edu/datascience>). This multi-institutional group of scientists and educators hope their efforts enhance a STEM identity and broaden participation from populations underrepresented in data science.

Biol-12 is a taste of what it's like to be a genomics data scientist, providing students access to tools found at research institutions and primarily to upper-level students: instruction in genomics, current datasets, cloud computing tools, high quality R tutorials, interactions with scientists, and an opportunity to pursue authentic research questions and share findings.

Dr. Alcazar has opened “Science Talks”, guest speakers within the Biol-12 course, to all interested students regardless of their academic path. On Sept 16th, neuroscientist from Johns Hopkins University Dr. Lindsay Hayes gave her science talk on “Prenatal immune stress induces a diminished immune activation in the brain that impacts neural circuit connectivity” and on Sept 23rd Dr. Matt McCoy from Stanford School of Medicine presented on “The role of gene complexity in the evolution and function of nervous systems”. Both scientists were available for an “Ask Me Anything” session and this was followed by a genomics data science activity in RStudio, tailored specifically for Biol-12 students. Two more talks are currently being scheduled for this semester and an announcement will soon be released.
