### Construction and New Facilities

#### Applied Technology Building

Work started on the new Applied Technology Building in early April 2022. This 66,000 square foot building has a budget of 57.1 million dollars and is funded with Measure C dollars and state bond funds. Currently, excavation is taking place and we poured the foundation on August 10. The project is currently on schedule and it is anticipated that it will be completed during the fall 2023 semester.



#### Parking Expansion

Central Valley Asphalt was awarded the bid for the Clovis Community College Parking Expansion project at the June 14 Board of Trustees meeting. On July 25, work started on the new parking stalls near Chestnut and International. The project includes 566 concrete parking stalls. The use of concrete will eliminate the need for the periodic maintenance that is required for an asphalt surface. This project also includes a new entrance to the campus from Chestnut Avenue and enhancements to the corner of Willow and Behymer Avenues, which will include new curb and gutters along Behymer as well as new landscaping. We anticipate receiving approval soon from the City of Fresno to start work on the Chestnut entrance and Behymer beautification. This project is expected to be completed in early 2023.



### New IT Booking Tool

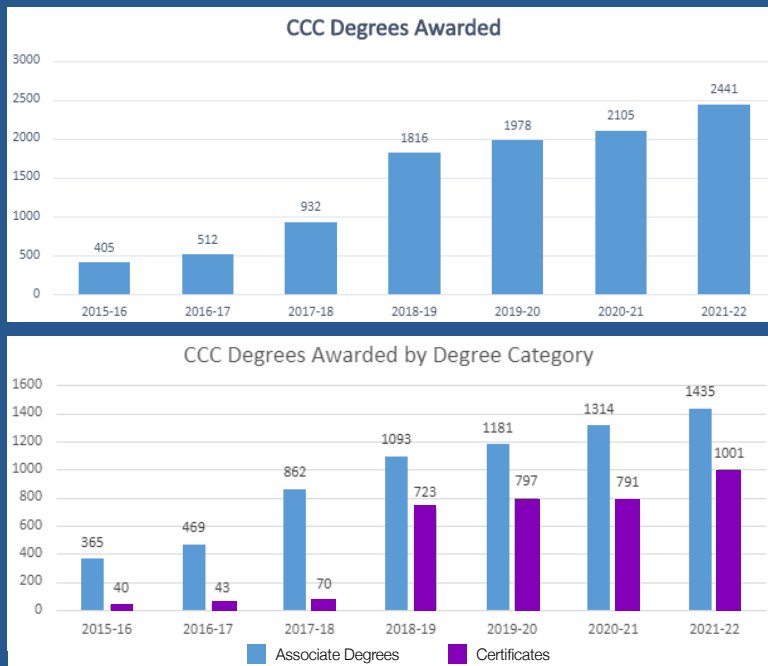

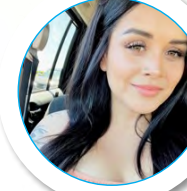

- Dr. Shawn Fleming-Jones received a doctorate in Education in Leadership and Learning with an Emphasis in Higher Education from Aspen University. Her dissertation, Correlation of a Single Predictor to Student Success and Retention in Undergraduate STEM Degrees, focused on the correlations between students receiving a C in an introductory STEM course and their overall success in STEM programs using a non-experimental correlation design. After defending her dissertation, she was informed that she was nominated for Dissertation of the Year.
