Students had an engaging and interactive day learning about professional health careers and transfer opportunities from current professionals, students, and administration officers at the conference. Conference attendees also enjoyed networking at the Pre-Health Fair and participated in interactive workshops such as the "Nursing School Admission Panel," "Stop the Bleed," "Mock Clinical Case Studies in Occupational Therapy," and "Tailoring Your Resume for Pre-Health Opportunities."



"One of my favorite parts of the conference was getting to hear from people in the medical school admissions explain the whole process and being able to ask them questions and get immediate feedback," said CCC student Gabriel Ribeiro. Kathryn Watrous learned about the pathways to achieve her career goal of becoming a nurse. "It was awesome, no one had broken down the nursing pathway before and explained all the opportunities," she stated.

Surveys indicated that students felt more confident about belonging in a STEM Pathway, exploring a variety of health professions, and more knowledgeable about the admissions requirements for their desired Pre-Health degrees and programs.

collaborative performing ensembles, access to professional audio studios, and supportive faculty mentorship. Students can earn four unique Certificates of Achievement in Commerical Music or work toward an Associate Degree for Transfer in Music.



At Clovis Community College, we believe the creativity and expression we achieve through art and music are fundamental to our college's spirit. As an example, we showcase our students' achievements at our bi-annual Student Art Showcase, which features musical performances, original student works, and collaborative stop-motion pieces by student musicians and visual artists.
