5. Critically evaluate essential methods and tools of Anthropology.

To obtain the Anthropology Associate of Arts Degree for Transfer, students must complete the following requirements (pursuant to SB1440 §66746 and CCR, title 5, §55061):

- Completion of 60 semester units or 90 quarter units that are eligible for transfer to the California State University, including both of the following:
- The California General Education Transfer Curricula (Cal-GETC).
**Students who maintain catalog rights prior to Fall 2025 may use IGETC or CSU-GE Breadth.*
- A minimum of 18 semester units or 27 quarter units in a major or area of emphasis, as determined by the community college district.
- Obtainment of a minimum grade point average of 2.0. Associate Degrees for Transfer (ADTs) also require that students must earn a "C" grade or better in all courses required for the major or area of emphasis.
- Certification of Cal-GETC is required. Cal-GETC advising sheets are available in Student Services, AC2-133 or online at [CCC GE \(Cal-GETC\) GE and Major Sheets](#)
- Courses may double count in the major and Cal-GETC.
