To obtain the Associate in Science in Hospitality Management for Transfer Degree, students must complete the following. Associate Degree for Transfer requirements (pursuant to SB1440 §66746 and CCR, title 5, §55063):

- Completion of 60 semester units or 90 quarter units of degree-applicable courses,
- Minimum overall grade point average of 2.0,
- Minimum grade of "C" (or "P") for each course in the major, and
- Completion of Cal-GETC
 - *Students who maintain catalog rights prior to Fall 2025 may use IGETC or CSU-GE Breadth.
- Certification of California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC) is required. Cal-GETC advising sheet is available in Student Services, AC2-133 or online at CCC GE and Major Sheets.
- Courses may double count in the major and Cal-GETC.
