- ✓ To graduate from a CSU a U.S. Government (including California) course (POLSCI 2 or 2H) and a U.S History course (HIST 11, 12, 12H) must be completed.
- Fresno City College (FCC), Reedley College (RC) and Madera Community College (MCC) courses may satisfy requirements differently than Clovis Community College (CCC). See the FCC, RC, and MCC Cal-GETC Worksheets or go to http://www.assist.org for courses completed at RC, FCC, MCC, and all other California Community Colleges.
- Completion of the California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC) will permit students to transfer from a California Community College to a California State University (CSU) or University of California (UC) campus generally without the need, after transfer, to take additional lower-division, general education courses to satisfy campus general education requirements. It is strongly recommended that students complete Cal-GETC prior to transfer. Advantages of completing Cal-GETC include more flexibility in class selection at the university and timely progress to degree completion. All UC and CSU campuses will accept the completed Cal-GETC to satisfy all lower-division general education requirements.
- Students who are eligible to use Cal-GETC: ICAS developed Cal-GETC for use by California Community College transfer students. A student may be Cal-GETC certified if they have completed coursework at any of the California Community Colleges without regard to current enrollment status or number of units accrued at a CCC.
- Restrictions for Returning Students: Students who initially enroll at a UC campus, then leave and attend a community college, and subsequently return to the same campus are considered "readmits" by the UC. Such students cannot use Cal-GETC. CSU does not have a system-wide policy that addresses these students and/or this reverse-transfer situation and thus there is no prohibition on use of Cal-GETC for students returning to the CSU from a CCC. - Students transferring to a CSU with a completed Cal-GETC will still need to complete 9 semester units of upper-division general education (GE) after transfer and may be held to other campus specific graduation requirements outside of general education and major coursework.

Credit for External Exams

There is no limit on the number of external exams that can be applied to Cal-GETC. External exams may be used regardless of when the exam was taken. *Cal-GETC Standards v1.2 pg.15*

Advanced Placement (AP)

- A score of 3, 4, or 5 is required to grant credit for Cal-GETC certification. An acceptable AP score for Cal-GETC equates to either 3 semester or 4 quarter units for certification purposes. Each AP exam may be applied to one Cal-GETC area as satisfying one course requirement. (See Cal-GETC Standards v1.2 pg.15) Students who have earned credit from an AP exam should not take a comparable college course because transfer credit will not be granted for both.
- There is *no equivalent AP exam for Area 1B* Critical Thinking and Composition requirement.
- Students earning scores of 3, 4, or 5 in the physical and biological science AP examinations earn credit toward Cal-GETC Area 5 and meet the Cal-GETC laboratory activity requirement.

International Baccalaureate (IB)

- A score of 5, 6 or 7 on Higher Level exams is required to grant credit for Cal-GETC certification.
- An acceptable IB score for Cal-GETC equates to either 3 semester or 4 quarter units for certification purposes.
- Actual IB transfer credit awarded for these and other IB exams for admission is determined by the CSU and UC.
